



FOIRE RICEVILLE FAIR

Antique Classes (pre-1960):

1. Tractor must be registered before the beginning of its respective class. Driver must sign the waiver sheet before pulling.
2. Tractor must be pre-1960. Any exceptions must be approved by the committee or a track official.
3. Wheels can be filled with calcium or other liquid.
4. No traction chains, dual wheels, differential locks or 4 wheel drive allowed.
5. The hitch must be at the Maximum height of 20" above the ground.
6. Classes will be determined by the weight of the tractor and driver combined. It is the driver's responsibility to register the tractor in the proper class. 100 lbs grace will be allowed (a tractor competing in the 4500 lbs. class can weigh a maximum of 4600lbs including the driver).
7. The tractor must look "stock" with no modifications showing. The committee or track official reserves the right to accept, refuse or remove a tractor from a class.
8. The speed limit for pulling is 4 MPH. If the tractor exceed 4 MPH, the horn will sound once, if speed is exceeded again, the horn will sound a second time and the tractor will be disqualified from the respective class.
9. The driver must remain seated at all times during the pull.
10. Before each pull, the tractor must go to the scales, where the weight and hitch height will be checked. If the tractor does not meet the class weight or hitch height, it will be disqualified from its respective class.
11. The tractor can pull a maximum of 2 times during the day. This may be in different classes or with different drivers.
12. If a weight or any other piece or the tractor falls off of the tractor during the pull, the tractor will be disqualified from the respective class.
13. The committee or track official have the right to make, change or adjust the rules before a class starts.
14. If flagged by an official to STOP! You must stop immediately and put your tractor in neutral. If you fail to do so you will be disqualified from the respective class and from pulling the rest of the pull.
15. Antique classes are: 2500lbs, 3500lbs, 4500lbs, 5500lbs, 6500lbs, 7500lbs, 8500lbs, 9500lbs, 10500lbs, 11500lbs. if there is a demand for heavier class or "modified" class it can be created. In the case of only one heavy or one "modified", tractor will be allowed to pull in the nearest class, but will not qualify for a prize. "Modified" tractor must be equipped with wheelie bars, no exceptions. There must be a minimum of two tractors per class to have a class.

Farm Stock 1960 +:

1. Tractor must be registered before the beginning of its respective class. Driver must sign the waiver sheet before pulling.
2. No 4 Wheel drive allowed, except if ALL tractors in the class are 4 wheel drive and it is agreed upon to use 4 wheel drive.
3. Wheels can be filled with calcium or other liquid.
4. No traction chains allowed.
5. Hitch height - Stock
6. Classes will be determined by the weight of the tractor and driver combined. It is the driver's responsibility to register the tractor in the proper class. 100 lbs grace will be allowed (a tractor competing in the 4500 lbs. class can weigh a maximum of 4600lbs including the driver).
7. The tractor must look "stock" with no modifications showing. The committee or track official reserve the right to accept, refuse or remove a tractor from a class.
8. The speed limit for Farm Stock is 6 MPH
9. The driver must remain seated at all times during the pull.
10. Before each pull, the tractor must go to the scales, where the weight and hitch height will be checked. If the tractor does not meet the class weight or hitch height, it will be disqualified from its respective class.
11. The tractor can pull a maximum of 2 times during the day. This may be in different classes or with different drivers.
12. If a weight or any other piece or the tractor falls off of the tractor during the pull, the tractor will be disqualified from the respective class.
13. NO weights are to be located anywhere behind the rear axle of the tractor (hydraulic arms). Exceptions may be made by track officials for demonstration pulls.
14. If flagged by an official to STOP! You must stop immediately and put your tractor in neutral. If you fail to do so you will be disqualified from the respective class and from pulling the rest of the pull.
15. The farm stock classes are: 7500lbs, 9500lbs, 11500lbs, 13500lbs, 15500lbs, 17500lbs, 19500lbs, 21500lbs, 23500lbs, 25500lbs. If there is a demand for heavier class or "modified" class it can be created. In the case of only one heavy or one "modified", tractor will be allowed to pull in the nearest class, but will not be qualified. "Modified" tractor must be equipped with wheelie bars, no exceptions.
